

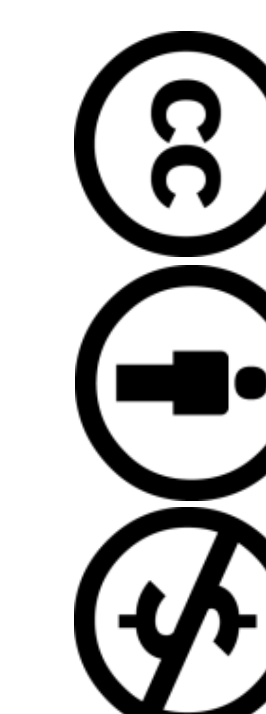

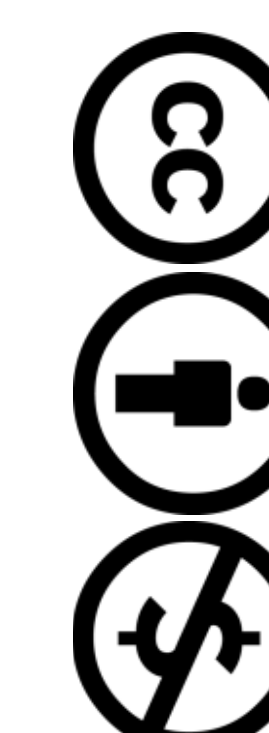

4. (a) Disinfection..... The Foden Lorry is being used.
- (b) Prevalence of Vermin..... Not unduly prevalent.
5. (a) Cooking Shelters..... Satisfactory.
- (b) Quality of food..... Good.
6. Water (a) quality..... Good.
- (b) Sterilization..... By Chlorination and boiling.
7. Latrines..... Flyproof Box Latrines Town W.C. System.
8. Undue prevalence of preventable Diseases..... Slight outbreak of Influenza in 12th. and 14th. Bdes.
9. Sick wastage continues to keep fairly low.
10. Cases of Diptheria were reported amongst the civilians at Hastiere. Dwellings where cases occurred were thoroughly disinfected and civilians suffering from the diseases were evacuated to Civilian Hospitals. Brigade Concert Halls have been thoroughly disinfected.
