Artillery HQ. did not vacate HOSPICE till 10 p.m. last night. Major MORLET and Tent Subdivis-
 -ions shewed much enterprise and energy in making ready the Hospice in the limited time.
 Major MORLET was placed i/c of the Hospital arrangements. His arrangements were excellent -
 two large front rooms being set apart for stretcher cases and the rear rooms for Walking
 Wounded. All cases came through main front door and were seen by admitting officer as they
 came off the cars. Adequate provisions were made for clerks, O.S. Buffet, rechauffement,
 etc., and check on evacuations; W.W. and Stretcher cases were effectually segregated
 from admission till evacuation.

Till 6 a.m. only one case had been received. After that wounded came in briskly and by 9 a.m. were coming in rapidly. Between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. 832 cases had been received, recorded, every case redressed and shaven if necessary, given A.T.S., and refreshment and evacuated. Badly shattered limbs were amputated and collapsed cases given rechauffement. No. 242 S/Sgt. WEYMOUEN, (MM) had designed and constructed two rechauffement apparatuses which proved very suitable. This design is light and packs up into small space (Diagram as Appendix No. 4.) "B" and "C" Section Tent Subdivisions ran stretcher dressings rooms and "A" Section Tent Subdivision W.W. by day. Tent Subdivision of 10th. Aust. Field Amb. by night.

The patients arrived in very good condition from the front. After 10 p.m. patients came in slowly. There was a fairly large proportion of wounded P.O.War, many of them serious stretcher cases. There was a congestion of stretcher cases between 4 p.m. and 10 p.m. due to the inadequacy of M.A.C. Cars of which we had 36. The average time M.A.C. cars occupied on the forward and return journeys to C.C.S. at VIGNACOURT was 5 hours. This was mostly due to the great distance to the C.C.S. but partly (as the N.C.O. i/c informed me) to the delay in unloading at the C.C.S. often amounting to one hour.

W.W. were evacuated with great ease on account of the arrangements made by the D.D.M.S., to evacuated by Light Railway from VECQUEMONT.

The C.C.S. group also did not return all our blankets and stretchers ; the numbers deficient being considerable.

Attached is a DIAGRAM of Apparatus for warming casualties suffering from shock resulting on exposure, and loss of blood.

The apparatus consists of a pair of trestles with a collapsible and detachable railing which supports a rubber sheeting curtain around the stretcher upon which the patient is lying.

The curtain reaches from the railing, 12 inches above the stretcher, to within 12 inches of the ground or floor.

An attached blanket covers the top of the frame, forming a lid thus the patient is enclosed, with the exception of his head, in a hot air chamber.

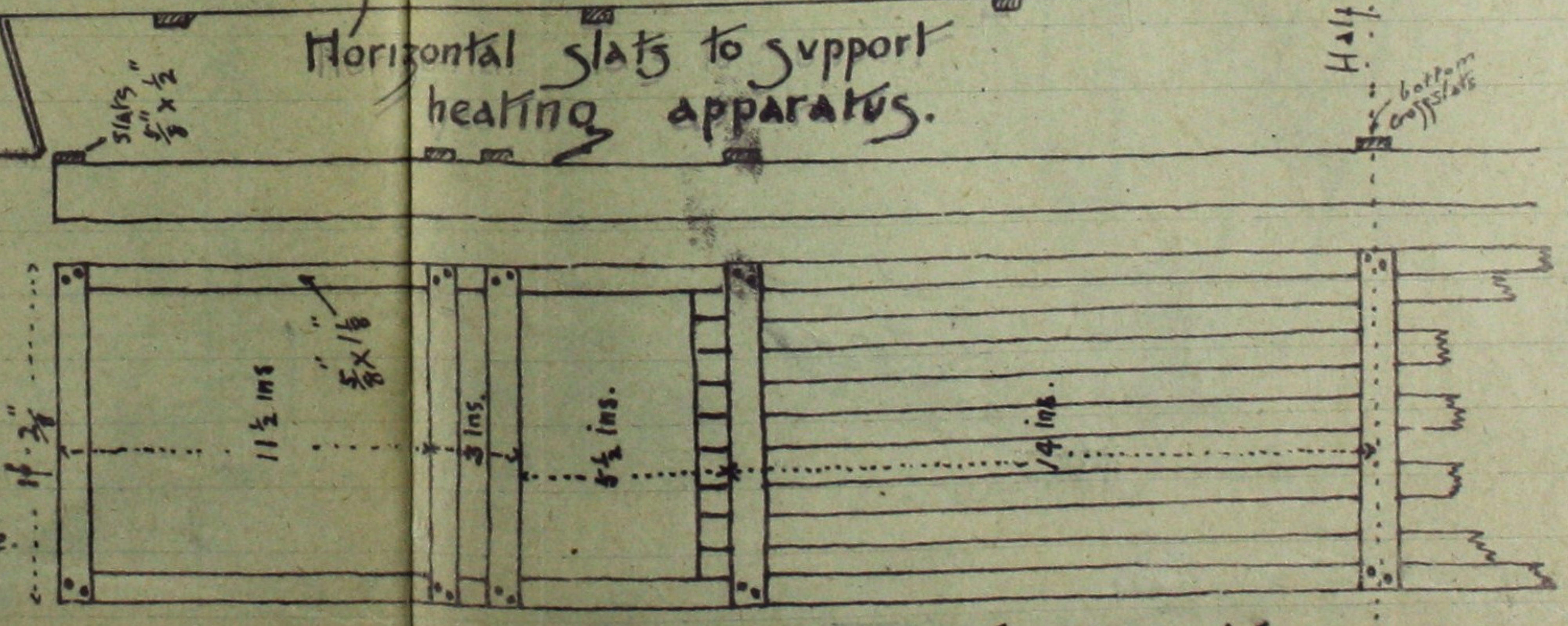
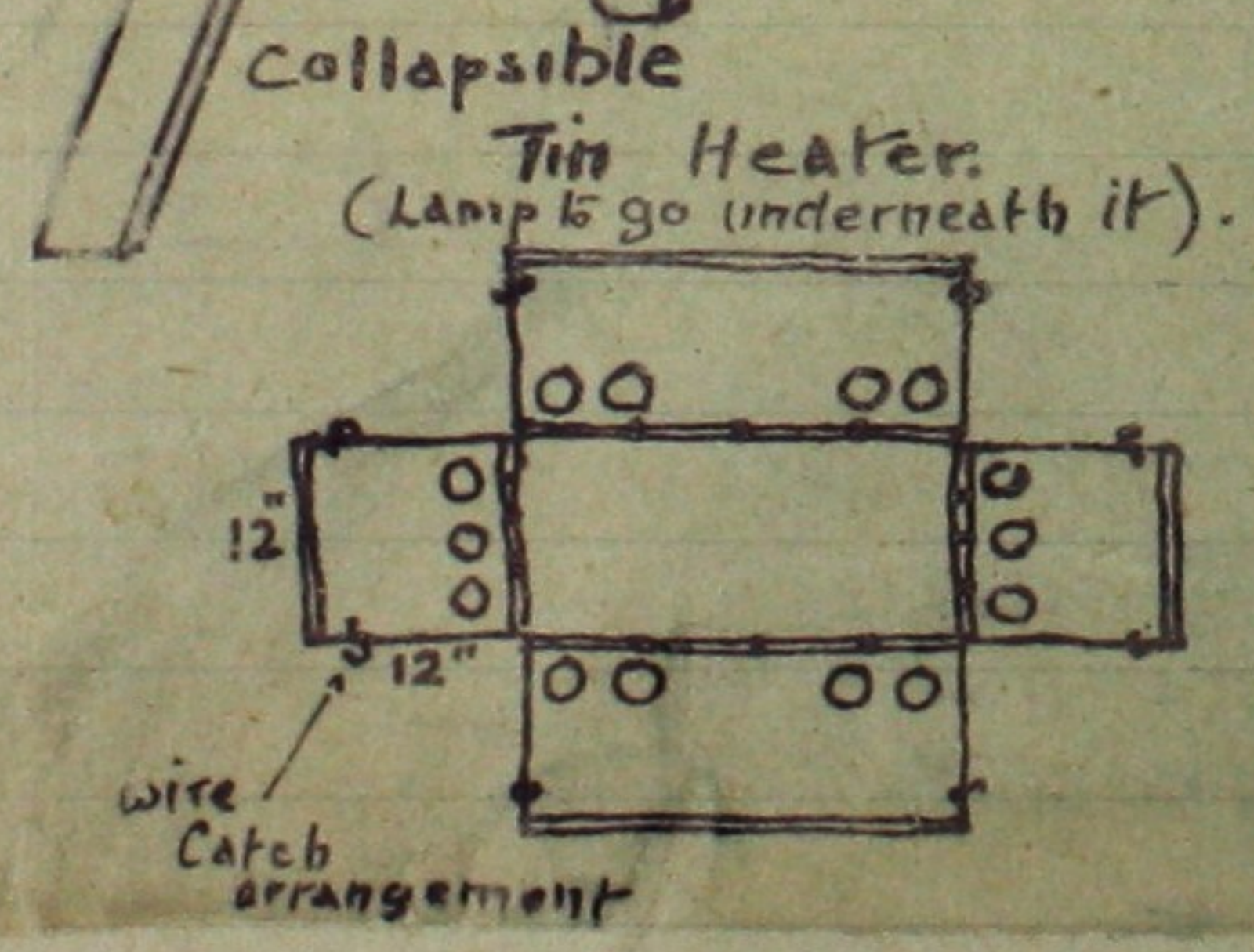
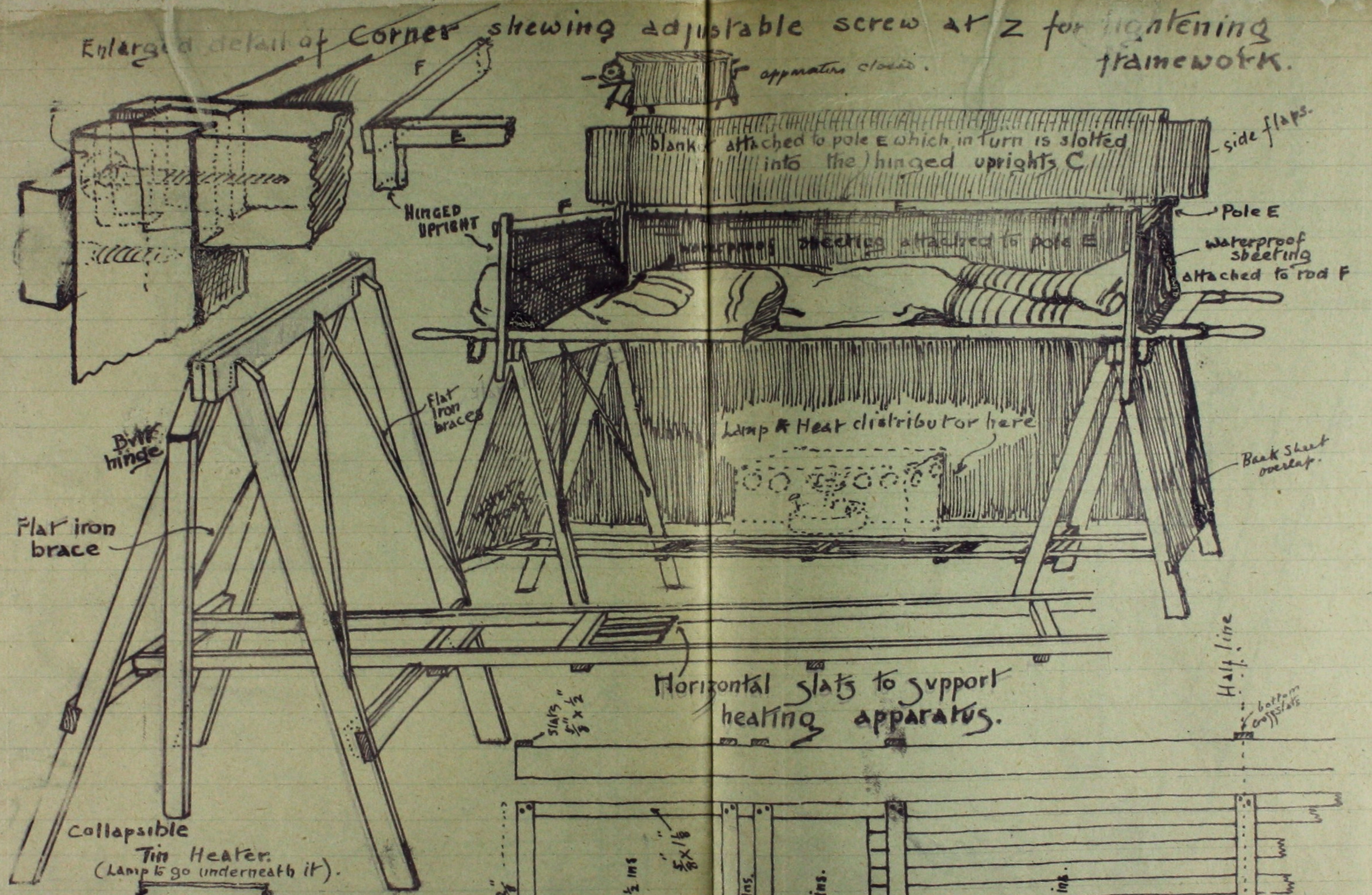
By releasing a small catch the railing can be dropped, allowing the stretcher to be removed. An exchange of patients and re-adjustment of curtains can be effected in at least two minutes.

The heat is supplied by a primus stove, which is placed in a case on a frame under the patient. Around the sides of the case (made of tin), near the top, are holes, 2" in diameter, by means of which the heat is evenly distributed.

A space 2" wide all round, between the curtain and the stretcher allows the heat to curl up over the body of the patient ensuring that the whole of the body is equally warmed.

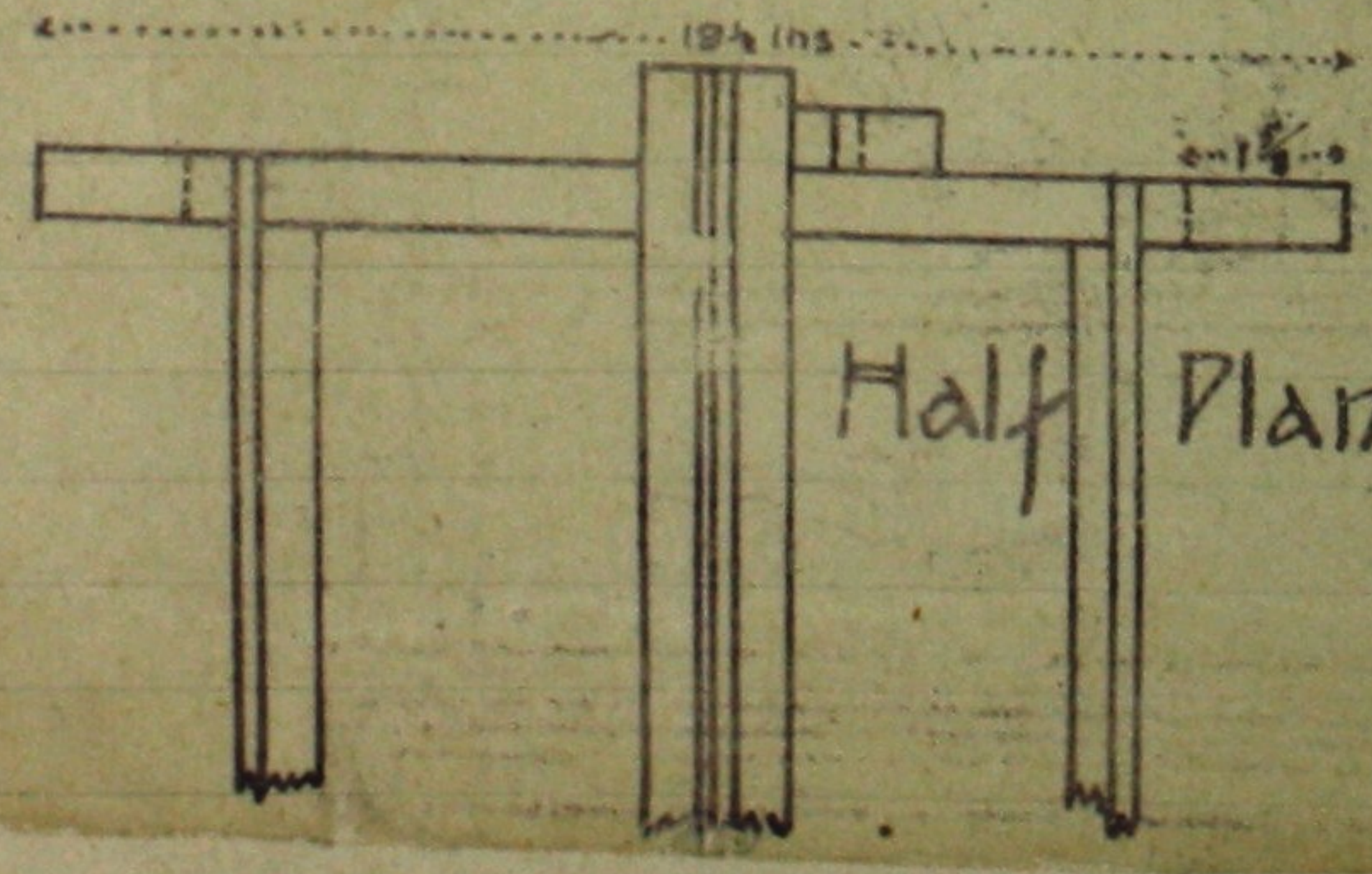
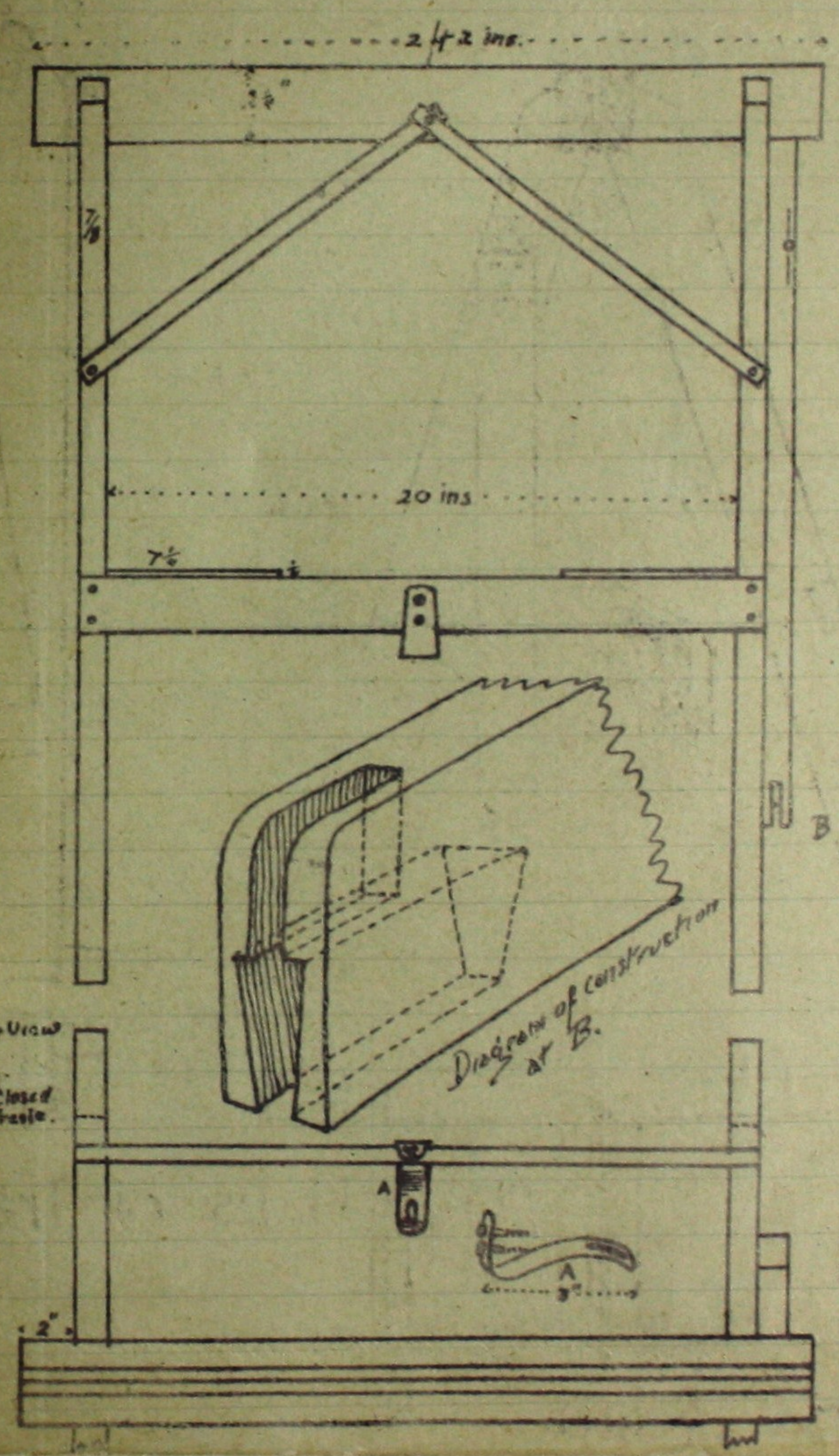
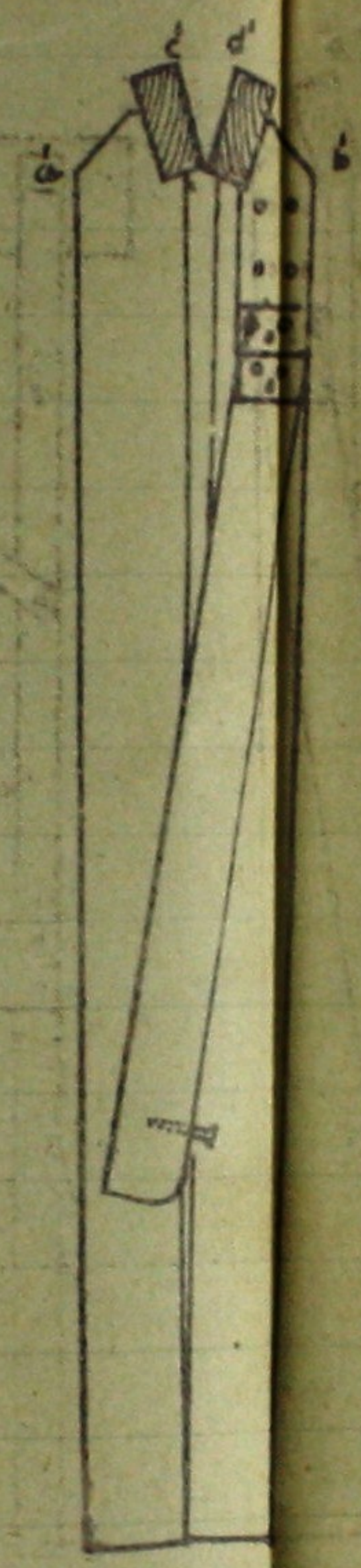
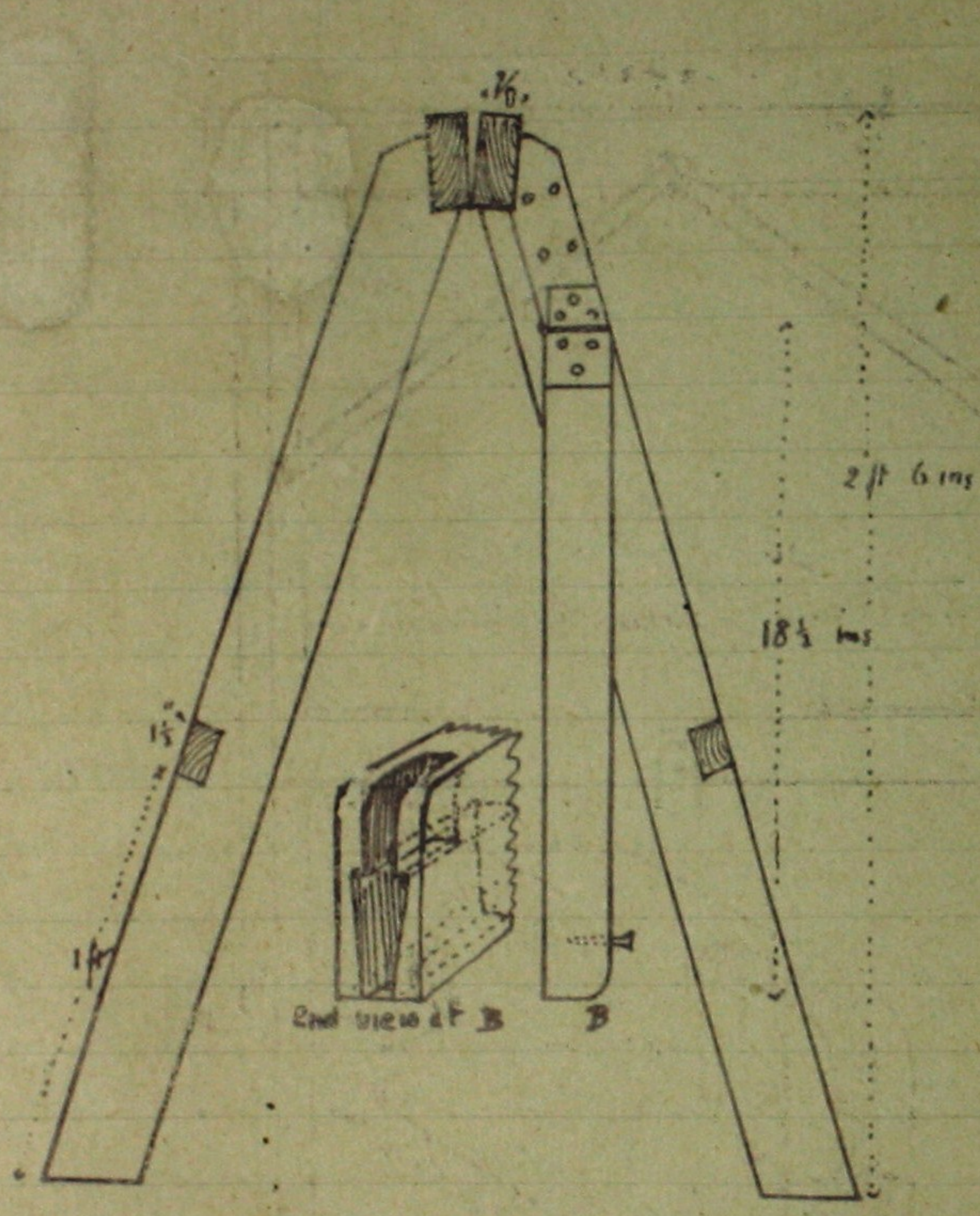
Sketch plan & elev. of heating apparatus support.

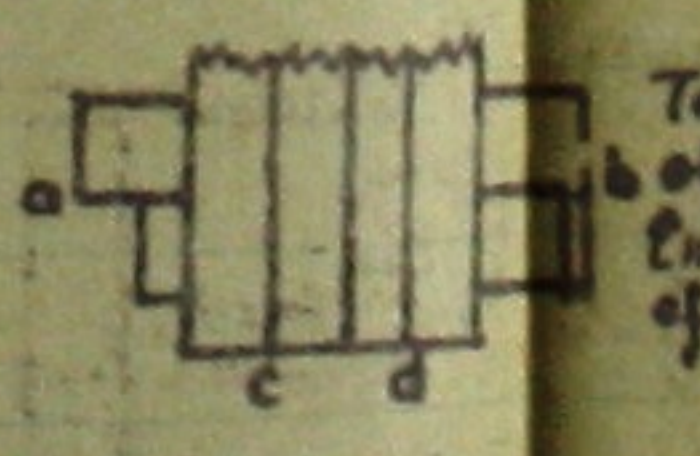


End Elevation. End Elev. Closed. Side Elevation.

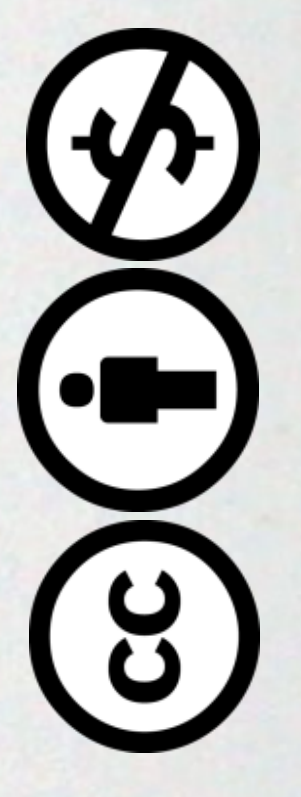

The many successful offensives which the Brigades and Battalions of this Corps have so brilliantly executed during the past four months have been but the prelude to, and the preparation for, this greatest and culminating effort.-

Because of the completeness of our plans and dispositions, of the magnitude of the operations, of the number of troops employed, and of the depth to which we intend to overrun the enemy's positions, this battle will be one of the most memorable of the whole war; and there can be no doubt that, by capturing our objectives, we shall inflict blows upon the enemy which will make him stagger, and will bring the end appreciably nearer.-

I entertain no sort of doubt that every Australian soldier will worthily rise to so great an occasion, and that every man, imbued with the spirit of victory, will, in spite of every difficulty that may confront him, be animated by no other resolve than a grim determination to see through, to a clean finish, whatever his task may be.-

The work to be done tomorrow will perhaps make heavy demands upon the endurance and staying powers of many of you; but I am confident that, in spite of excitement, fatigue, and physical strain, every man will carry on to the utmost of his powers until his goal is won; for the sake of AUSTRALIA, the Empire, and our cause.

I earnestly wish every soldier of the Corps the best of good fortune and a glorious and decisive victory, the story of which will re-echo throughout the world, and will live forever in the history of our home land.-

It rests with higher authority that such good work be gratefully recognised, but as regards this Mission, we feel it our duty to express our gratitude and say how highly we appreciate the privilege of being attached to the 4th Division.
