





QUARTERMASTER'S MONTHLY REPORT to accompany War Diary for Sep


During the month the Unit has had three donations of Gifts from the Australian Comforts funds consisting of Jam, Milk, coffee and cocoa and milk, sweets, custard powders, biscuits, sugar, socks and four cases of sundries.- these gifts have greatly supplemented the rations issued to the men.

There has also been a full supply of rations during the month. On account of always being on the move, we have not been able to hold any patients and no Medical Comforts have been drawn.

No issues of clothing, boots etc. have been made to personnel during the month as the bearers being detailed for duty with other ambulances, we have not been able to attend to this matter.

REPORT BY TRANSPORT OFFICER - to accompany WAR DIARY

In the early part of the month advantage was taken of the fact that the Ambulance was resting, to thoroughly clean and paint the vehicles.

As rations and certain medical stores must always be transported to the Unit only a few vehicles could be tackled at one time. - nevertheless, by 6th. instant 4 G.S. Wagons and 2 water carts were finished. On that date the Unit was suddenly ordered to move to the forward area.

The Unit Transport moved with the rest of the Brigade Transport to BAICHES staging one night at MORCOURT. At BAICHES on 7th. inst. the Bearer Subdivision was rejoined and until the 24th. the complete Unit moved to many villages around PERONNE. During the month 91 miles were covered by the Transport as a whole.

DIFFICULTIES ON MARCH: Very hilly country was encountered on many occasions but the teams were always able to pull their respective loads with extraneous assistance.




