What size battery does my camera take? Do you have a film to fit this? Will my camera take flash pictures — or a close-up lens — or high-speed film?

All dealers will be familiar with these questions. They crop up with monotonous regularity and some can be decidedly difficult to answer. Now, in this comprehensive pamphlet, we have brought together all the information we could find to help you answer these and many other questions about 'Kodak' Cameras produced since 1901.

Kodak started producing cameras in 1888 but we chose to restrict this pamphlet to those made since 1901 because film is no longer available for any of the models produced before that date.

The most detailed section covers the 110, 126 and instant cameras produced since 1963. Millions of these cameras are in use around the world so, not unnaturally, most questions concern them.

Many of our cameras take batteries to power flash, exposure meters or camera motors. We have included details of these batteries and a table of the alternatives available from different manufacturers. There is also a handy illustrated chart showing the various batteries at about actual size to help you identify them easily.

Since 1901, literally hundreds of different models of 'Kodak' Cameras have been made. In fact, there are over 160 different models of 'Kodak' BROWNIE Cameras! The finding and listing of all these cameras was a formidable — but often nostalgic — task.

1982 saw the introduction of the revolutionary 'Kodak' Disc Cameras. These cameras should increase the picture-taking ability of everyone who has ever looked at a good photograph and said, "I wish I could take pictures like that". Now, because of the many features that have been built into these cameras, that wish can, at last, become a reality.

Also in 1982 came the introduction of a new range of instant cameras called KODAMATIC Instant Cameras. These cameras are designed to take a faster film than previous instant cameras, having a speed of ISO 320/26° (ASA 320/26DIN) which will give the user better pictures under a wider range of lighting conditions and distances. KODAMATIC Instant Color Film HS144-10 is intended for use only with the KODAMATIC Instant Camera: 'Kodak' Instant Colour Film PRI44-10 is for use with the earlier 'Kodak' Instant Cameras. However, film packs will carry instructions on using mismatched film/camera combinations by adjusting the lighten/darken controls.

When we came to the pre-1963 cameras we grouped similar camera models together and arranged them in alphabetical order. This should make life easy for you — and for us! The common question people ask when they bring such a camera to you is, "Can I still get a film to fit it?". Presently available film sizes for cameras produced between 1901 and 1963 are listed alongside each camera.

If the particular camera you are asked about is not listed, this means that it takes an obsolete film size such as 118, 122, 130, etc. We will be pleased to provide information about such cameras if you need it, but we don't offer a valuation service. For this, customers should be directed to dealers, valuers or auctioneers specializing in old photographic equipment.

Compiling this list brought back many happy memories of cameras we have known. For giving us this excuse, we are grateful to the many dealers who wrote asking for the information. However, we are sure this pamphlet will provide more than just a chance to reminisce!

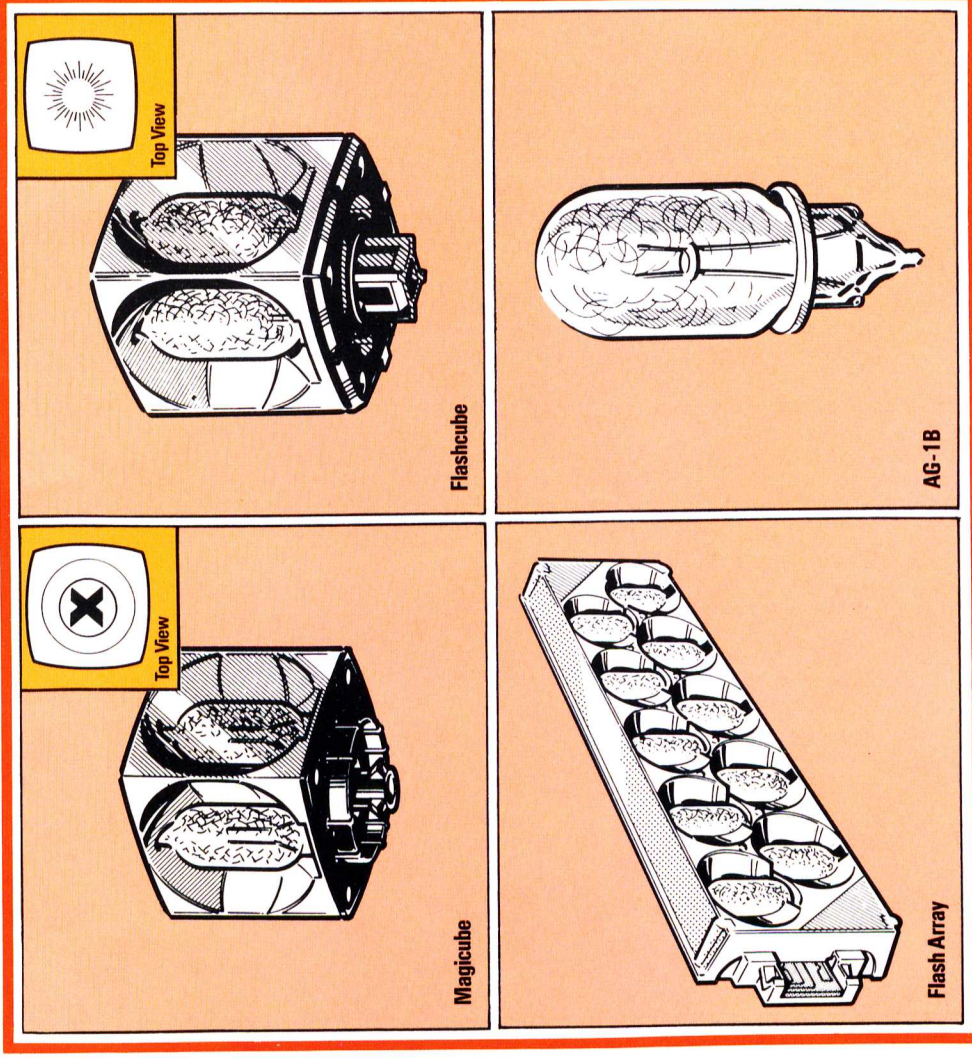
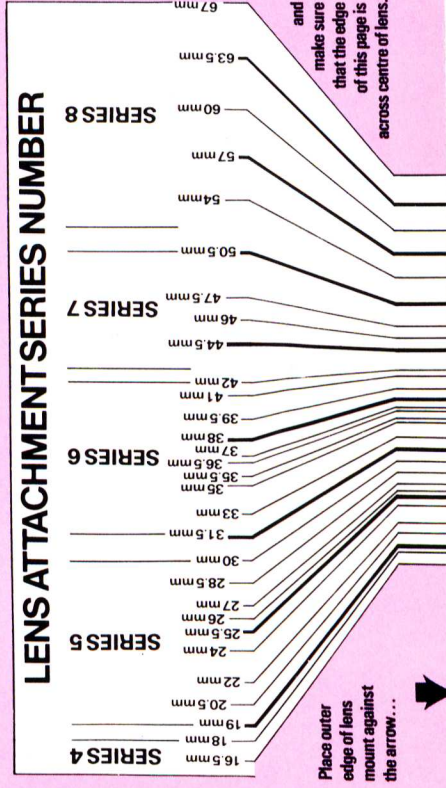

# LENS ATTACHMENT SCALE

## and 'Kodak' Flash Units

To find size of attachment, lay scale across centre of lens with arrow at outside of lens mount. Correct size of attachment (in millimetres) is shown at other side of lens mount. Prongs of attachment can be bent slightly if no listed size provides exact fit.
