

Information :-

The advance of 4th. Army to the Belgian - German frontier is to be carried out in three stages as under :-

- (a) From present line to the approximate line FRANCHIMONT - METTE - CHATELET - JUMET.
- (b) From the above line to the approximate line DEYFELDT - SALMCHENHEAD - REGNE - VILLERS ST. GERTRUDE - OCCQUIER.
- (c) From the above line to the Belgian - German frontier from about DEYFELDT on the right to about FRANCHEVILLE on the left.

The BELGIAN - GERMAN frontier will not be crossed pending further orders.

Each Corps is moving forward on a two Division front each Division on a separate road.

The Australian Corps is to be concentrated in LE CATEAU area before moving forward to the Rhine.

1. Ambulances will be prepared to move with their respective Brigade Groups to LE CATEAU area at any time after 19th. inst. (inclusive.)
2. Ambulance Commanders will get in touch with Brigade H.Q. and make necessary arrangements for clearing sick of Brigade Group en route.
3. C.O. 5th. Aust. Field Amb. will detail a large ambulance car to move with 2nd. Aust. Div. Artillery group.
4. No dumps will be left in the present area. A Divisional Dump will be formed in LE CATEAU area. It is not desired to take forward sick or unsound animals and extra baggage.

ADVANCE into GERMANY.

Instructions No. 1.

1. The advance of the Allied forces commences today, 17th instant.
2. The British forces detailed for the advance are organised into 2 Armies, the 4th and the 2nd, each of four corps and 16 divisions.

The 4th Army consists of :-

- 2nd Cavalry Division.
- 8th Corps.
- 4th Corps
- Aust. Corps.
- 9th Corps.

The Aust. Corps consists of 1st, 2nd, 4th and 5th Divisions.

The advance of the 4th Army will be carried out in accordance with the attached table, (vide attached Map).

3. The enemy is to be clear of the 3 zones referred to on the date preceding our advance into that zone. Any enemy encountered on the march will be made prisoner, with the exception of detachments left behind by the enemy in charge of war material which the German Army may wish to hand over. Such detachments will be set free as soon as the stores are taken over on charge by British detachments. Enemy detachments must, however, be accompanied by escorts of our own troops until they are clear of our lines.
4. The advance of the 4th Army is being covered by the 2nd Cavalry Division. The 9th Corps on the Right and the 8th Corps on the Left will be the two leading Corps. It is not yet decided whether the Australian or 4th Corps will move by train or by road. If the movement is by road the Corps will follow the 9th Corps moving by two roads with the 4th Australian Division leading on the Right and the 1st Australian Division on the Left. There will be two divisions preceding the 4th Aust. Division on the same road; the division immediately preceding the 4th Aust. Division will be the 6th Division.
5. The Division will be organised for the march into four groups, 3 Infantry Brigade Groups and a Divisional Artillery Group. The composition of these Groups will be notified. For the present Brigade Groups A, B, and C will remain in being as formed for the move from the CAVILLON Area. During the march the Pioneer Battalion will be attached to the leading Brigade Group, H.Q. and the fourth M.G. Company of the M.G. Battalion to the second Brigade Group, and the Mobile Veterinary Section to the Divisional Artillery Group. Groups will march in the following order, 13th A.I. Bde. Group, 12th A.I. Bde. Group, 4th A.I. Bde. Group, Divisional Artillery Group. Divisional H.Q. will move in two echelons to be designated "A" and "B" Echelons. "A" echelon will consist of the "G" and "A.Q". Staff, and the administrative staff necessary for the conduct of the march and will move by bounds, probably at 2 or 3 day intervals. "B" echelon will move with the column, attached to "C" Brigade Group.

- (c) Helmets and box respirators will be carried.

1.- The training of the troops during the period of an armistice and during demobilization is of the first importance. The object of such training must be :-

(i) to maintain the high standard of discipline which has characterised the British Armies throughout the War and prepare it for the resumption of hostilities should this take place.

(ii) to fit those returning to civil life for their future occupations.

2.- Training will therefore consist of :-

- (a) Military Training.
- (b) Educational Training.
- (c) Recreational Training.

Military training and work should be restricted to 3 or 4 hours a day at the most (including any work such as salvago, filling in trenches, etc.) It should aim at producing a high standard of drill, and special attention should be paid to dress and equipment, and to the general appearance of the troops on and off parade. Route marching should be included. Ceremonial parades will be hold when the weather is fine. Demonstrations should be arranged in the use of balloons for observation, sound ranging, flash spotting, anti-aircraft shooting, projectors, trench mortars, wireless telegraphy and telephony etc. Visits should be arranged between detachments of different arms. 30 yards ranges will be built and shooting competitions arranged by every unit.

Educational Training will be carried out in all formations and units, by the formation of voluntary classes. Special facilities will be given to enable all ranks to attend these classes by excusing them from at least 1 hour's military training a day, and, as far as possible, from fatigues. Lectures will be arranged on "After the War Problems".

Recreational Training will be encouraged by the organisation of competitions in football, running, boxing, etc., in all formations and units. Brigade, Division and Corps Staffs will assist regimental and other officers in the organisation of such

competitions. Trips should also be arranged to places of interest as far as possible.

3.- Arrangements should be made for the provision of lecture halls for educational purposes, recreation rooms and canteens supplied with writing paper and indoor games in the billeting area of each unit.

4.- The Field Marshal Commanding-in-Chief wishes all Commandors to give this matter their closest attention.
