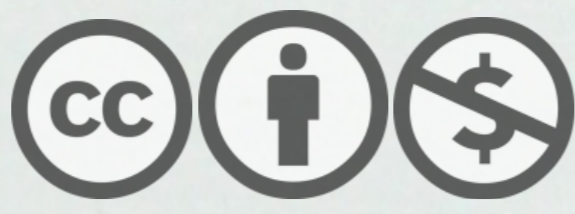

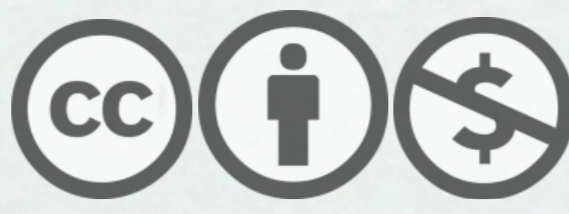
Horse No 260

Left Langwarrin Camp
on the 12th Feb 1902 &
embarked on the Saint
Andrew for S Apica
weighed anchor & stood
off Williams town for
the night. Started
Thursday 13th from
Williams town & reached
Albany Sunday 18th &
couldd left Albany
on Wed 19th Feb &
reached Durban 10th
March 1902 26 days out
from Melbourne



after an uneventful
voyage Landed all
the horses in good
condition
disembarked on the 11th
& entrained for (240)
Newcastle & reached
there 13th March
& went into camp on
Kitchener's Kop which
has a fort on top
14th was on outpost
duty
16th was out scouting
17th Capt. Majori Boys

Camped at
Palmfontein & church
parade in camp
Mounted patrol
28th Camp fire
concert at Palmfont-
fontein
The Boer
1st Mail on Klerksday
1st May struck camp
& marched to
boom Laayle
2nd day 1st
capture of one
Boer boy about
12 yrs old after
firing 15 shots



4th struck camp at
Dooms Laaghi & set
to Palmet for ten
mail left for
Klerks drop

6th struck camp
& left Palmet for ten

7th started a drive
going towards
Dryburg
capturing
257 Prisoners
144 Rifles
6000 Ammunition

300 sheep LeBeau
460 cattle Command
370 horses
850 wagons
21 + 4 mules

40 donkeys
finished 11th May 1901
at Leaufruit
DeLisle gives up his
command of Australian
unit to ill health &
leaves for England
Aus Brigade join
Col Williams
column



13th Rode into
Vryburg for Cap Day
15th Martial of Ede
16th church at
Lennepoort & trek
across the border
of Bechuanaland
17th pergt Ede reduced
to the ranks
passed by Schape's
farm
Cap 7th promoted to
pergt
18th marched to
boom Laagte

21st arrived in
Klerksdorp
Mr Seddon ^{visited} entertained
the New Zealanders
at Klerksdorp
Sickles put in
Hospital
22nd Pay Day £3
15/- owing up till end
of April
23rd Pay 15/- Paid
till end of April
24th shifted camp
to Boschkop

25th served out with
Rum & drank it for
the first time

^{prob} Giles had sentence
passed on him 84 days
but was let off with
42 days hard labour



27th March B & C Coys
& New Zealanders
left camp & Vics
went to Bothas Pass

28th A Coy left camp
& marched to
~~Konigsberg~~ Konigsberg

30th Easter Sunday
Communion at the
Fort Konigsberg

April 1st left
Konigsberg & went to
Mullers Pass & returned
on the 2nd April
& built Tangaers

Left Konigsberg on the
5th & came to Newcastle
struck Camp at
Newcastle on Sunday

April 6th & made
Ingogo station near
Majuba & camped

7th April left Ingogo
& passed Majuba
Lains Nek &

Charlestown & en-
trained at Volksrust
for Klerksdorp

& passed through
Stander ton Johannesburg



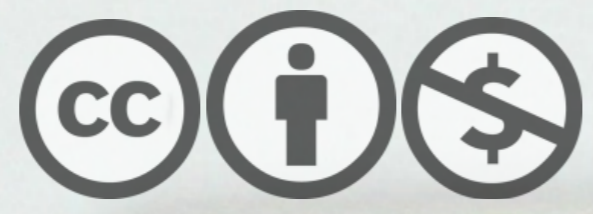
Potchefstroom & arrived
at Klerksdorp on the
9th April & Camped
10th & 11th Peace
conference at Klerksdorp
12th Collision on the
railway & 17 New
Zealanders killed &
25 wounded
13th 14th Batt^{ns} arrived
at Klerksdorp and
inspection by
Colonel Thorneycroft
New Zealanders
funeral at Klerksdorp

15th Columns came
into Klerksdorp
16th inspection by
Col De Lyel in camp
17th 1st & 2nd Batt^{ns}
on parade before
Col De Lyel
18th Handed in horse to
Remount Dept & got
a remount in exchange
Guns arrived in camp
2-13th rounds & a pompan
Capt. Bruce left
Army & went on
staff



18th M^r Day takes
command of a Coy
19th Left Klerks drop
& started on trek
19th struck camp and
shifted about a
mile & set camp
with guns &
army service corps
started as gallop
for Capt Day
20th Church parade
in camp

21st a day off & went
into Klerks drop for
M^r Day
22nd visit & inspection
of the camp by Lord
Kitchener & staff
23rd struck camp &
started on the march
Victorian overcoats
handed in & Cavalry
cloaks issued in
exchange
~~passed~~ through
Mallebery m^{tn} which
was deserted



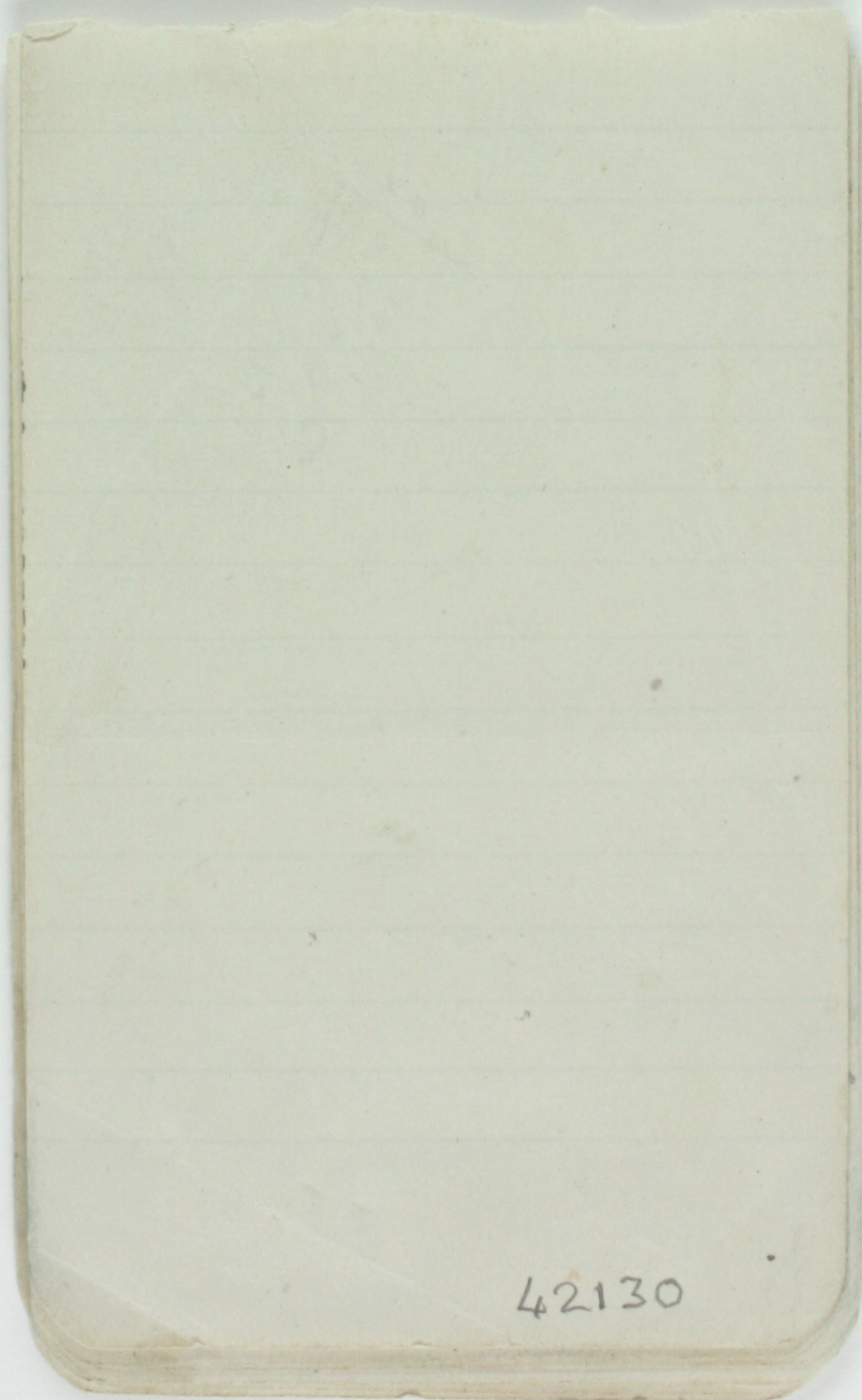
